Haiku Poems



A haiku poem is a type of poetry that comes from Japan. It's a short poem made up of only three lines. Each line has a certain number of syllables, which are the sounds we make when we say words. **In a haiku, the first line has 5 syllables, the second line has 7 syllables, and the third line has 5 syllables again.** Haiku poems often talk about nature and the world around us. They use simple words to create vivid pictures in our minds.

Haiku Poem Example



Cherry blossoms bloom (5 syllables)

Pink petals dance in the breeze (7 syllables)

Spring's beauty unfolds (5 syllables)

In this haiku, we can picture the beautiful sight of cherry blossoms blooming in the springtime, swaying gently in the breeze. It captures the essence of the season with just a few words.

Haiku Poem Example

Raindrops softly fall (5 syllables)

Puddles reflect the grey sky (7 syllables)

Nature's lullaby (5 syllables)



In this haiku, we can imagine the peaceful scene of rain falling gently, creating puddles that mirror the sky above. It evokes a sense of calm and tranquillity found in nature's rhythms.

Haiku Seasons Poems

Winter

Spring

Blossoms paint the trees (5 syllables)
Birds sing songs of new beginnings (7 syllables)
Nature wakes from sleep (5 syllables)

This haiku celebrates the arrival of spring, with trees adorned in colourful blossoms, birds chirping melodies of renewal, and nature emerging from its winter slumber, bursting with life and vitality.
